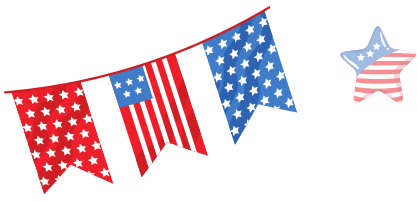

Write the face value of each bill. Then, draw a line to match each bill and the name of the American president.









